



# Instructions


1. Sew one A square between two B squares. Press in the direction indicated by the arrows. Make 12.




2. Sew a step 1 unit between two C strips. Press. Make 12.




3. Sew two D strips to the top and bottom of a step 2 unit. Press. Make 2 of each fabric for a total of 12 units.




4. Sew two E strips to the sides of a step 3 unit. Press. Make 2 of each fabric for a total of 12 units.




5. Sew two F strips to the top and bottom of a step 4 unit. Press. Make 12.




6. Sew two G strips to the sides of a step 3 unit. Press. Make 12.



Make 2 of each block for a total of 12 blocks.



7. Sew one H square to one A square. Press. Make 24.



8. Sew one I strip to the right side of a step 7 unit as shown. Press. Make 24.




9. Sew a J strip to the bottom of a step 8 unit as shown. Press. Make 24.



10. Sew a K strip to the side of a step 9 unit as shown. Press. Make 24.




11. Sew a L strip between two step 10 units. Make 12.



12. Sew one M square between two L strips. Press. Make 6.




13. Sew one step 12 unit between two step 11 units. Press. Make 6.



14. Cut two N squares once on the diagonal to make four half square triangles.




15. Cut three O squares twice on the diagonal to make 12 quarter square triangles. Only 10 are needed so there will be 2 leftover.



16. Using the two different blocks and triangles, sew together in rows as shown. The triangles are larger than the blocks, any excess will be trimmed off later.

17. The ↗ symbol indicates cross seams from row to row. Line up the cross seams with right sides together. Pin to secure. Sew the rows together. Press.

18. Trim the sides as shown leaving ¼" from the outer corners of the blocks.



Leave ¼" seam allowance from the block corners.




19. Sew the border strips together in pairs end-to-end to make long strips. Measure the width of the quilt top, and cut two borders to match that width. Sew to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward the borders.  
Next, measure the length of the quilt and trim two borders to match that length. Sew to the sides of the quilt and press toward the borders.



20. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting and quilt top (right side up). Baste layers to secure.
21. Quilt as desired.
22. Trim the backing and batting flush with the quilt top. Bind the edges using a 3/8" wide seam allowance.
