



Fabric 6	10307-G	Fat Quarter
Fabric 7	10306-B	Fat Quarter
Fabric 8	10305-B	Fat Quarter
*Fabric 9	10307-B	Fat Quarter
	*F9 binding	1/2 yard
Fabric 10	10304-E	Fat Quarter
Fabric 11	10302-B	1-1/8 yard
Fabric 12	10301-E	1 panel
Backing	108" wide	2 yards
	44/45" wide	4 yards

Note: Use Fabric 9 for the binding.

Cutting

Fabric 1

A - Cut (4) 3-7/8" x WOF strips into (36) 3-7/8" squares. Cut once on the diagonal for (2) triangles.

F1 - Sashing/Inner Borders Cut (10) 2-1/2" x WOF strips Sew together end to end. Subcut into: (4) 2-1/2" x 45-1/2" sashing strips

(2) 2-1/2" x 49-1/2" top/bottom borders (2) 2-1/2" x 53-1/2" side borders

Fabrics 2

Cut (4) 2-1/4" x WOF strips into B- (10) 2.25" x 9.5" rectangles C - (10) 2.25" x 6" rectangles

Fabrics 3, 4

Cut (4) 2-1/4" x WOF strips into B -(8) 2.25" x 9.5" rectangles C -(8) 2.25" x 6" rectangles

Fabrics 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10 From each fabric:

D -Cut (1) 9-7/8 square. Cut once on the diagonal.

E - Cut (3) 3-7/8" squares. Cut once on the diagonal.

*Fabric 9 - Binding Cut (7) 2-1/4" x WOF strips

Fabric 11 - Outer Borders
Cut (6) 6" x WOF strips. Sew together end to end. Subcut into:
(2) 6" x 57-1/2" side borders
(2) 6" x 60-1/2" top/bottom borders

Fabric 12 - Printed Fruit Bowl Squares

Fussy Cut (13) 6" squares. *You will have 2 extra blocks.

WOF - Width of Fabric LOF - Length of Fabric RST - Right Sides Together HST - Half Square Triangle


Fancy Fruit Quilt Instructions

Please read all instructions before you begin. Seam allowance is 1/4. Fabric is abbreviated as 'F' - for example, F1 refers to Fabric 1. Press in the direction of arrows.

Basket Blocks

- 1. Sew the F1-A and F5-E triangles together to make a square. Press. Make 6.
- 2. Sew two step 1 squares together.
- 3. Top Row: Sew a F1-A triangle to the left side of the step 2 unit.
- 4. Middle Row: Sew a F1- A triangle to the left side of a step 1 square.
- 5. Sew a F1-D triangle to the bottom of the Middle Row unit.
- 6. Sew the top row and middle row together.
- 7. Sew a F5-F triangle to the step 6 unit. Make 2.

Repeat this process to make the remaining basket blocks as illustrated below.







Fruit Bowl Blocks

- 1. Sew an F2-C rectangle to either side of a F12 fruit bowl square. Press toward C.
- 2. Sew an F2-B rectangle to the top and bottom of the step 1 unit. Press toward B. Repeat to make 5 fruit bowl blocks with Fabric 2.

Repeat steps 1 and 2 to make one of each of the fruit bowl blocks shown below. You may decide to use different bowls for your blocks. Have fun making it your own!







Illustrations for Steps 1-2










Make 5 total F2 (orange) fruit bowl blocks (These 4 plus the one illustrated above)









Make 4 total F3 (green) fruit bowl blocks










Make 4 total F4 (blue) fruit bowl blocks

Sew the Rows

- 1. Sew the fruit bowl blocks and basket blocks into rows as illustrated.
- 2. Sew the F1 sashing strips in between each row. Press.



Sew the Borders

Illustrations on p.7

- 3. Sew the F1 inside borders to the sides of the quilt top. Press. Sew the F1 inside borders to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Press.
- 4. Sew the F11 outside borders to the sides of the quilt top. Press. Sew the F11 outside borders to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Press.

Tip: Pin the borders to the quilt top starting at the center and pinning out to the edge for each round. This will help to make sure you don't stretch the borders as you sew.



Finishing

- 1. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting and quilt top (right side up). Baste layers to secure. Quilt as desired. Trim the excess backing and batting.
- 2. Sew the binding strips together into one continuous strip. Press in half length-wise. Sew the binding to the quilt top with a 1/4" seam allowance. Turn the binding to the back side of the quilt and stitch down by hand with matching thread.
