





Binding	included in Fabric 6

WOF - Width of Fabric

Breezeway Quilt Instructions

Please read all instructions before you begin.

Seam allowance is 1/4.

Fabric is abbreviated as F: F1 refers to Fabric 1. Press in the direction of arrows.

Cutting

Finished Size: 52" x 68"

Fabric 1

Cut (2) 4" x WOF strips into
 A-(16) 4" x 4" squares (for (32) 3" HSTs)
 Panel Borders

Cut (3) 2-1/2" x WOF strips into
 (2) 2-1/2" x 40-1/2" side borders
 (2) 2-1/2" x 28 -1/2" top and bottom borders

Fabric 2

Cut (4) 4" x WOF strips into
 D-(28) 4" x 4" squares for (56) 3" HSTs

Cut (2) 5-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut into:
 B- (32) 2-1/2" x 5-1/2" rectangles

Cut (2) 6-1/2" x WOF strips into
 G- (2) 6-1/2" squares
 H- (2) 6-1/2" x 22-1/2" rectangles
 from the remaining cut

C- (4) 4-1/2" x 4-1/2" squares
 E- (4) 3-1/2" x 3-1/2" squares

Outer Borders

Cut (6) 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together,
 end to end and subcut into:
 (2) 2-1/2" x 52-1/2" top and bottom borders
 (2) 2-1/2" x 64-1/2" side borders

Fabric 3 *Directional

Cut (4) 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut into:
 A- (36) 4-1/2" x 4-1/2" squares

Fabric 4

Cut (2) 4" x WOF strips into
 D-(20) 4" x 4" squares for (40) 3" HSTs

Cut (1) 3-1/2" x WOF strip into
 F -(4) 3-1/2" squares

Fabric 5

D-(12) 4" x 4" squares for (24) 3" HSTs

Fabric 6

D-(12) 4" x 4" squares for (24) 3" HSTs

Binding

(7) 2-1/4" x WOF strips



Fussy cut one panel to 24-1/2" x 40-1/2"


Mountain Units and Rows

1. The Paper Piece template is on p.8. Copy at 100% to make 16 left and 16 right units. Piece using your preferred foundation paper-piecing method (FPP).

2. Sew 1 left and 1 right mountain unit together, as illustrated. Press open. Make 12 paired units.




3. Sew a mountain unit to either side of an F3-A square as illustrated. Press toward center. Make 4.



Step 2: Make 12


4. Sew the Round 2 rows: follow the illustrations below. Press in the direction of the arrows.

5. Sew the F1 side borders to the panel. Press.


6. Sew the F1 top and bottom borders to the step 5 section. Press.



Round 2 Top and Bottom Rows: make 2

7. Sew the Round 2 side borders to the step 6 section. Press.

8. Sew the Round 2 top and bottom borders to the step 7 section. Press.




Round 2 Side rows: make 2

F1 Inner Border -Top/Bottom: 2-1/2" x 28-1/2"





HST Units - 2 at a time


1. Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the F2-D squares.




Make 8

2. Place an F2-D square over an F4-D square. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from either side of the marked line. Cut on the marked line. Press toward F4. Trim to $3\frac{1}{2}$ ". Make 8 HSTs.

3. Repeat steps 1-2 with F1/F4 D squares. Make 32 HSTs.




4. Repeat steps 1-2 with F2/F6 D squares. Make 24 HSTs.

5. Repeat steps 1-2 with F2/F5 D squares. Make 24 HSTs.


6. Arrange the HSTs into pairs as illustrated. Sew into units. Press open.







Corner Units

1. Sew an F2/6 HST to the left of a F4-F square. Press towards F4. Refer to the illustration.



2. Sew an F2-E square to the left of an F2/6 HST. Press towards F2.





3. Sew the step 1 unit to the step 2 unit. Press open.



Make 4 corner units.

Round 3 borders:

1. Lay out the HST units, HST pairs, F2-G squares, F2-H rectangles, and the corner units as illustrated. Pay particular attention to the orientation of the HSTs. Press all following units open.
2. Sew an F2/6 HST pair to a F1/4 HST pair. Make 8.
3. Sew an F2/5 HST pair to a F1/4 HST pair. Make 8.
4. Sew an F2/5 HST to a F2/4 HST. Press open. Make 8 pairs, paying attention to the orientation.
5. Sew a step 4 pair to either side of a F2-G square. Make 2 sets.
6. Sew a step 4 pair to either side of a F2-H rectangle. Make 2 sets.
7. Sew the HST units together as illustrated to make the round 3 top/bottom borders.
8. Sew the HST units together as illustrated to make the round 3 side borders.

9. Sew a Round 3 side border to either side of the quilt top. Press open.
10. Sew a Round 3 top/bottom border to the top/bottom of the quilt top. Press open.

Outer (final) border:

1. Sew an F2 outer side border to either side of the quilt top. Press towards the outer border.
2. Sew an F2 outer top/bottom border to the top/bottom of the quilt top. Press towards the outer border.

Tip: Pin the borders to the quilt top starting at the center and pinning out to the edge for each round. This will help to make sure you don't stretch the borders as you sew.



Finishing



1. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting and quilt top (right side up). Baste layers to secure. Quilt as desired. Trim the excess backing and batting.
2. Sew the binding strips together into one continuous strip. Press in half length-wise. Sew the binding to the quilt top with a 1/4" seam allowance. Turn the binding to the back side of the quilt and stitch down by hand with matching thread.



1. Print and cut 32 paper templates at 100%.
2. Set your sewing machine stitch to 1.5 for these units.
3. Place the F3-A square face up over the wrong side of the paper. Place the F2-B rectangle RST on the upper edge of the template. Pin in place and sew through both layers and the template.
4. Remove paper after sewing.
