

Fabric 1 blue/green hearts *D A (3) 2" x 3.5" rectangles B (3) 5" x 12-1/2" rectangles C (10) 2-1/2" x 2-1/2" squares D (4) 3-1/2" x 3-1/2" squares E (4) 3-1/2" x 1-1/4" rectangles F (4) 2-1/2" x 2-1/4" rectangles G (2) 3-1/2" x 8" rectangles H (2) 1-1/2" x 8" rectangles I (3) 3-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles J (10) 4-1/2" x 3" rectangles K (12) 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangles K (12) 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangles L (13) 3-1/2" x 2" rectangles

Fabric 2 cream/pink hearts *D M (3) 4-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangles N (6) 6" x 5"" rectangles O (3) 2" x 8" rectangles P (10) 1-1/2" X 2" rectangles

Fabric 3 red/pink hearts *D Q (3) 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles R (12) 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangles

Fabric 4 green neighborhood toille *D S (2) 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles T (2) 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles U (6) 2-1/2" x 3" rectangles

Fabric 5 cream neighborhood toille *D V (3) 5" x 8" rectangles W (4) 2-1/2" x 3" rectangles

Fabric 6 pink neighborhood toille *D X (8) 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangles Y (5) 7-1/2" x 2" rectangles Z (7) 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangles

Fabric 7 blue neighborhood toille *D AA (5) 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangles Sashing: Cut (4) 2-1/2" x 42-1/2" strips across WOF Borders: Cut (5) 3" x WOF strips. Sew together end to end. Cut into: (2) Sides: 3" x 54-1/2" strips (2) Top/Bottom: 3" x 47-1/2" strips

Fabric 8 red library toss BB (6) 10-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangles

Fabric 9 blue library toss CC (5) 2" x 3-1/2" rectangles DD (5) 7" x 3-1/2" rectangles

Fabric 10 cream glasses EE (4) 2-1/2" x 10-1/2" rectangles

Cutting

Fabric 11 pink glasses FF (7) 2" x 3-1/2" rectangles GG (7) 7" x 3-1/2" rectangles

Fabric 12 blue glasses Binding: Cut (6) 2-1/4" x WOF Strips

From the remainder cut: HH (16) 1-1/2" x 2" rectangles II (4) 2" x 3" rectangles JJ (4) 5" x 3" rectangles

Fabric 13 blue books KK (8) 7-1/2" x 2" rectangles

Fabric 14 dark red books *D LL (6) 2" x 3" rectangles MM (6) 5" x 3" rectangles

Note: Directional fabrics indicated in the cutting instructions are cut length x width.


Readerville Quilt Instructions


Please read all instructions before you begin. Seam allowance is 1/4. Fabric is abbreviated as 'F' - for example, F1 refers to Fabric 1. Press in the direction of arrows. Use the \square check boxes to mark each step as you complete it.

Box Block

Gather F1-A, F1-B, F2-M, F2-N, F3-Q

- ☐ 1. Sew the F1-A rectangles to the F2-M rectangles. Press.
- 2. Sew an F2-N rectangle to either side of the step 1 unit to make the lower box section
- 3. Sew the F1-B and F3-Q rectangles together and then sew the B/Q unit to the lower box section. Press. Make 3.





Planter Base Units

Gather (3) each of F5-V and F2-O rectangles, and (6) F1-C squares

Note: There are three different planter blocks that use combinations of the units in this section.

- 1. Mark a diagnonal lines from corner to corner on the wrong side of (6) F1-C squares.
- □ 2. Place (1) F1-C square, RST, on the left side of a F5-V rectangle. Sew on the marked line. Trim 1/4" away from the sewn line, Press.
- ☐ 3. Place an F1-C square, RST on the right side of the step 2 unit. Sew on the marked line. Trim 1/4" away from the sewn line, Press, Make 3.
- 4. Sew a F2-O rectangle to the step 3 planter base units. Press. Make 3.

Plant Blocks

Gather F1-C, D, E, F, G, H rectangles and the F4-T, S rectangles.


Small Flying Geese


- ☐ 1. Mark a diagnonal lines from corner to corner on the wrong side of the F1-C squares.
- □ 2. Place an F1-C square, RST, on the left side of a F4-T rectangle. Sew on the marked line. Trim 1/4" away from the sewn line. Press.
- □ 3. Place an F1-C square, RST on the right side of the step 2 unit. Sew on the marked line. Trim 1/4" away from the sewn line. Press. Make 2.
- □ 4. Sew an F1-F rectangle to either side of the small flying geese units. Press. Then Sew an F1-H rectangle to the top. Press. Make 2.

Large Flying Geese

- □ 5. Repeat steps 1-3 to make the large flying geese units with the F1-D squares and the F4-S rectangles. Make 2.
- □ 6. Sew an F1-E rectangle to either side of the large flying geese units. Press. Make 2.
- ☐ 7. Sew an F1-G rectangle to the top of one step 6 unit. Press.
- 8. Sew the Plant Blocks together as illustrated below. Make 1 of each.















Plant Block 1 F1-G large geese unit planter base unit

Book Blocks

- □ 1. Sew Book Spine units together as illustrated below. Press in the direction of the arrows.
- □ 2. Sew the Book Spine units into the Book Blocks shown to the right. Use the A units for Block A and B units for Block B. Press seams open.







Sew the rows together

Note: Blocks and units are labeled in each row. There are several places where you will sew two units together.

- ☐ 1. Sew the blocks and units together as illustrated below. Press seams open.
- □ 2. Sew the sashing between the rows (see illustration on p.8)



Sashing and Border

- ☐ 1. Sew the side borders to the quilt top. Press toward borders.
- 2. Sew the top and bottom borders to the guilt top. Press toward borders.



Finishing

- \Box 1. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting and quilt top (right side up). Baste layers to secure. Quilt as desired. Trim the excess backing and batting.
- □ 2. Sew the binding strips together into one continuous strip. Press in half length-wise. Sew the binding to the quilt top with a 1/4" seam allowance. Turn the binding to the back side of the quilt and stitch down by hand with matching thread.
